I founded Tkiyet Um Ali in 2003 to provide sustainable food support and humanitarian food aid to Jordan's underprivileged. It was created in memory of my late mother, Her Majesty Queen Alia, whose humanitarian work remains one of my greatest inspirations. Today, after 16 years of providing nutritional needs to the neediest and the most vulnerable in our country, Tkiyet Um Ali continues in its pursuit of its vision to reach a hunger-free Jordan.

We look to the future with hope and enthusiasm, steadfast in our commitment to making Tkiyet Um Ali a shining beacon of hope and a bright spot in the lives of thousands of families. As we continue to feed more than 76,000 children and 38,000 women, and nearly 28,000 sick and elderly people, we are cognizant that our work provides its beneficiaries with more than just food.

I am so proud of our accomplishments, and the progress we made in 2019, as we expanded our operations and provided emergency food parcels, reaching an additional 10,000 families, above the existing 30,000 endorsed families, and more than 396,000 food parcels that are distributed annually. By year's end, Tkiyet Um Ali had also served over 85,000 daily lunches and 89,000 Iftar meals.

We value and appreciate the generous donations from our committed corporate and individual partners living in Jordan and abroad, which is a testimony that Tkiyet Um Ali continues to enjoy the trust of its donors, as it stands as a shining example of Jordanians helping their fellow Jordanians.

In 2019, we were shocked and saddened by the tragic loss of one of our dedicated members of the Board of Directors, Nasif Khoury. Nasif's valuable contributions to support the work of Tkiyet Um Ali, and my other initiatives – will undoubtedly be remembered, and our deepest condolences are extended to Nasif's family and to the wider TUA family.

I would like to express my deep gratitude to the honourable members of our Board of Directors for their committed service and guidance. Appreciation is also due for the dedicated staff of Tkiyet Um Ali, for their sincere work and tireless efforts, as they continuously contribute to the transformation of our plans into reality. In addition to the work of our wonderful volunteers who continue to inspire us with their contributions and support to our daily operations, and for which we are truly thankful.

Hand in hand, we can make a difference in the lives of our Jordanian brothers and sisters, as we strive to reach our goal of a hunger-free Jordan. While Tkiyet Um Ali's interventions will continue to adapt to upcoming challenges each year brings, we also have ambitious goals for 2020, which are founded on our past achievements and strengths acquired over the past years.



Tkiyet Um Ali... A Doorway onto Virtue

Her Royal Highness Princess Haya Bint Al Hussein, UN Messenger of Peace combating Hunger and Poverty, has laid the foundation for Tkiyet Um Ali to become the first non-governmental organisation of its kind in the Arab World aimed at eradicating food poverty.

Since then, Tkiyet Um Ali took a pledge upon itself to keep its doors open before all those in need, whether through the provision of daily hot lunch meals for wayfarers in need or through the Sustainable Food Aid Programme, which supports families living in extreme poverty and unable to secure their daily food across the Kingdom's governorates, with monthly food parcels.

In the years since Tkiyet Um Ali embarked on its journey, in 2003, and until the end of 2019, the food parcels which were distributed to families in need reached 2,026,481, in addition to 2,545,240 wayfarer and Ramadan Iftar meals were served. Moreover, over the past years, Tkiyet Um Ali was able to perform 237,805 Udhiyah under the Adahi programme on behalf of its donors, to distribute meat to families in need throughout the Kingdom.

In 2019, Tkiyet Um Ali implemented a number of food aid programmes to realise its vision of reaching a hunger-free Jordan. To that end, Tkiyet Um Ali waved off the year with the distribution of more than 396,210 monthly food parcels for families in-need living in extreme poverty across all of the Kingdom's governorates, within the framework of the Monthly Food Parcels Programme.

Tkiyet Um Ali has always been and will remain open to wayfarers in need. More than 85,215 hot lunch meals were served to wayfarers at Tkiyet Um Ali's headquarters in Al Mahatta, Amman, through the Wayfarer Programme, which provides lunch meals to more than 400 individuals a day, securing 60% of the individual's daily nutritional needs. This is why Tkiyet Um Ali chose Al Mahatta for its headquarters, in order to be close to those in need and wayfarers unable to secure the price of a meal.

During Ramadan of 2019, Tkiyet Um Ali served more than 89,531 Iftar meals under the Mawa'ed Al-Rahman Programme, which was held at its headquarters in Al Mahatta, aside from the iterations of the programme set up in various other governorates.

During Eid Al Adha in Australia on behalf of its donors in compliance with Sharia laws, under the supervision of a Mufti from the Jordan General Iftaa Department. Throughout Eid, 21,230 Udhiyah were preformed, the Adahi meat was distributed to endorsed families under the Sustainable Food Aid Programme throughout the entire year.

Noteworthy as well is the more than 10,000 families in need in the West Bank and the Gaza Strip, who have benefited from the Adahi Programme meat in 2019.



Controls

The responsibility of constructing a system of good governance falls upon the Board of Directors, whose task is to directly supervise the management team and staff, who serve the beneficiaries and facilitate the donors', sponsors' and volunteers' contributions, maximising their role at Tkiyet Um Ali, in a way that reflects the best results on beneficiaries and the society.

The Board of Directors and its committees at Tkiyet Um Ali supervise the performance of the executive management and ensures the realisation of goals and public policies, in addition to setting up the general framework for the strategic plan, and evaluating and reviewing it periodically. Moreover, the Board ensures the effectiveness of internal controls and risk management regulations, aside from overseeing the timely preparation and issuance of the annual report for approval by the General Assembly, which serves the efficient and effective advancement of TUA's goals.



Internal and External Audit

Given the importance of the audits and their results, this particular stage undertakes a number of steps. The internal auditor of the Audit and Risk Committee of Tkiyet Um Ali's Board of Directors is tasked with auditing and monitoring procedures, data and financial reports to ensure their alignment with the laws applicable to Tkiyet Um Ali, whereas an external auditor is contracted to thoroughly review and audit Tkiyet Um Ali's unified financial statements and issue the financial report.



Transparency and Disclosure

Tkiyet Um Ali greatly values transparency and disclosure as some of its most fundamental premises, as it ensures the full disclosure of all information relevant to its operations and financial data, without any misrepresentation. Accordingly, the Board of Directors' Audit Committee takes on the task of reviewing financial information for future disclosure and publishing in Tkiyet Um Ali's annual report, which is distributed among all stakeholders and partners, then published online via TUA's website. These data include the report of the external auditor and its clarifications, general budget, income statement and supporting tables that explain costs and income-expenses data.



Efficiency

As Tkiyet Um Ali is keen on realising its approved goals with effectiveness and efficiency, it periodically evaluates its employees through reviewing and evaluating the organisational structure and assigning clear tasks for every job description. Moreover, Tkiyet Um Ali implements its procedures in alignment with the approved policies and procedures guide, which is periodically reviewed for the purpose of updating it in accordance with the requirements of work.

To this end, Tkiyet Um Ali ensures that all tasks are implemented as per the policies framework, aimed at protecting the organisation, its employees, beneficiaries and partners. These policies include: equality and non-discrimination, internal audit, disclosure, creativity and innovation, among other policies undergoing approval and review.

TUA's adherence to the criteria of good governance at the organisation contributes to boosting its credibility and transparency, which in turn helps it achieve its objectives and goals, leading to the realisation of Tkiyet Um Ali's strategy and sound performance monitoring in a way that ensures long term continuity and sustainability.

Tkiyet Um Ali Accredited as a Member of the Global FoodBanking Network (GFN)

Tkiyet Um Ali (TUA) was accredited in 2019 as a member of the Global FoodBanking Network (GFN), an international non-profit headquartered in Chicago, seeking to eradicate hunger around the world, through launching food banks in more than 30 countries and providing the necessary support. TUA's membership with the GFN crowns Tkiyet Um Ali's accomplishments over the years, resulting from the consolidated efforts of the organisation's management team and staff, and their attentiveness to uphold the highest criteria of service for more than 30,000 beneficiary families living in extreme food poverty across the Kingdom's governorates.

Having met all of the GFN membership requirements, TUA underwent thorough auditing by the network, which covered all aspects of TUA's conformity with the criteria of eligibility for the accreditation, including its governance and transparency procedures.

The Global FoodBanking Network carried out several visits to Tkiyet Um Ali's headquarters in Amman in 2018 and 2019, commending the services provided by TUA, as well as its routine procedures and operations in regards to implementing the principles of good governance and transparency, while underlining the importance of Tkiyet Um Ali's efforts to eradicate hunger in Jordan. The Network also highlighted TUA's strategic goals, which are in alignment with the objectives of the Global FoodBanking Network, calling for the eradication of hunger and all practices pertinent to food waste.



A Doorway onto Fieldwork

Reality on the Ground





Fieldwork plays a critical role in the family endorsement process, which ensures the provision of aid to the most impoverished and families in-need.

Families in need can apply through the nearest accredited partner CBO, or they can apply directly by calling Tkiyet Um Ali's call centre operating 8 hours a day and receiving thousands of phone calls from applicants and beneficiaries.

After the family applies to benefit from Tkiyet Um Ali's Sustainable Food Aid Programme, its application undergoes desk review. Afterwards, a field visit team is tasked with visiting the family and conducting an on-the-ground assessment and study of the family's situation, upon which the family is endorsed for the Sustainable Food Aid Programme.

In alignment with Tkiyet Um Ali's relentless efforts to support families living in extreme food poverty in Jordan, TUA spares no effort to provide healthy food aid for these families on a monthly basis, by developing the approved endorsement mechanisms in accordance with specific and reliable criteria, entailing maximum transparency.



Testimony of a Field-Visit Team Member

"My journey with Tkiyet Um Ali started in 2017. When I first stepped through its doors, it never crossed my mind that it will become an integral part of my character. I never thought that I will find everything I strived for through my work with Tkiyet Um Ali, and most importantly the humanitarian work that serves the wellbeing of society as a whole.

I should say that Tkiyet Um Ali really opened doors for me, enabling me to do fieldwork and visit places that I never knew existed, which allowed me the opportunity to meet people of all backgrounds and origins. The moment I entered this new world, I was overwhelmed by a compelling sense of enthusiasm that I never before experienced. Yet, it came with the shock of having to come face to face with the reality of TUA's beneficiary families. Over the course of my work at the Operations and Family Endorsement Section, I became used to conducting field visits to TUA's endorsed families. Field visits are a critical step in the family endorsement process, through which the reality of these families is assessed. The houses I visited, though, are nothing like the houses we live in, nor are their lives anything like the lives that we lead. That is when I realised that my work with Tkiyet Um Ali has helped me broaden my perspective and horizon to experience things and worlds I never even knew existed before.

My job as a Social Researcher has added greatly to my character; it greatly strengthened me and reinforced my self-esteem and self-reliance in the face of uncertainty, as fieldworkers can run into any one and any situation behind the doors they knock on to conduct their studies.

Despite the many tears I shed, the sadness never came in the way of my realisation of the fundamental change that Tkiyet Um Ali induces in these families' lives or what value it brings to them.

With time, I became eager to work in the field, until my job became something that I look forward to, instead of a mere duty that I must do, for I can see firsthand the fruit of my labour on the faces of these families I visit.

There is no nobler act than to leave a good trace on people's lives, like the trace Tkiyet Um Ali leaves at the passages of these families' lives, whose daily food is always TUA's top priority. "

A Doorway onto Reality

Impact on the Ground



Whether beneficiaries, volunteers or employees, Tkiyet Um Ali opened its doors to thousands of people in 2019. Therefore, TUA conducted a number of studies intended to measure the reality of its programmes' impact on the ground, through surveys that showed the following results:

- Wayfarer Programme (Daily Hot Meals):

individuals have been depending on the wayfarer meal for three years and more.



21%

of the total sample eat fruits once a month.

of the total sample depend only on the Wayfarer Programme to eat fruits.

- The Mawa'ed Al Rahman Programme:

of the Mawa'ed Al Rahman Programme's beneficiaries have no other source of food for Iftar during the Holy Month of Ramadan but Tkiyet Um Ali.

-The Sustainable Food Aid Programme "Monthly Food Parcels":

A Doorway onto Beneficiaries



Which families benefit from Tkiyet Um Ali's programmes? And to which segments of society your donations go?

Tkiyet Um Ali's door is open to 30,000 families, all living in extreme poverty, comprised of nearly 150,000 individuals, of whom 76,623 are children.



Among TUA's endorsed families, 27,979 individuals have illnesses, of whom 17,153 are heads of families and depend on Tkiyet Um Ali to secure their daily food.

Tkiyet Um Ali's assistance also extended to 2,095 individuals with disabilities of whom 1,179 are with physical disabilities and 916 with mental disabilities accounting for 1.50% of TUA's endorsed individuals, whereas the percentage ratio for TUA's endorsed individuals suffering from illness and chronic diseases is 20.01%.

Moreover, Tkiyet Um Ali endorses 9,565 female family heads consisting of divorced, single, widowed or abandoned female beneficiaries.

Meanwhile, 6.93% of TUA's endorsed families live in tin houses, tents, bedouin camps, asbestos, wooden housing, mud houses or caravans.

Tkiyet Um Ali endorses families in need from the most vulnerable in our population of whom 69.71% are unable to work, and 31.88% are supported by female heads while females account for 61.30% of TUA's beneficiaries.



A Doorway onto Feeding





Tkiyet Um Ali's doors are open every day, all year long, to thousands of people in need. Whether endorsed families across the Kingdom's governorates, benefiting from the Sustainable Food Aid Programme, or wayfarers who found no where else to eat.

In 2019, Tkiyet Um Ali distributed more than 396,210 monthly food parcels as part of its extensive efforts to provide sustainable food aid for Jordan's most impoverished families. Additionally, TUA served 85,215 hot lunch meals during the Wayfarer Programme and served 89,531 Iftar meals as part of Mawa'ed Al Rahman Programme during the holy month of Ramadan. Also, TUA performed 21,230 Udhiyah on behalf of donors, the meats of which were distributed among Tkiyet Um Ali's endorsed families.

The Sustainable Food Aid Programme (Monthly Food Parcels Programme)

Thanks to the aid provided by TUA under the Sustainable Food Aid Programme, 30,000 families living in extreme poverty were able to secure their daily food across the Kingdom's governorates in 2019.

Tkiyet Um Ali adopts a clear methodology to endorse families, based on a number of criteria, as follows:

- 1- The family's income per capita does not exceed JOD 20.00 per month.
- 2- The family does not own any sort of property.
- 3- The family does not have any unemployed members who are able to work and not working.

Once Tkiyet Um Ali concludes its desk and field review (study) of these families, ensuring that they meet all of the eligibility requirements for endorsement, TUA starts delivering monthly food parcels to these families, currently counting 30,000 across the Kingdom's governorates.

With each parcel containing 24 food commodities. Tkiyet Um Ali also takes into consideration the number of family members, to ensure that the food parcels cover the family's daily nutrition needs for the entire month.

TUA's endorsed families are mostly fragile households enduring severe food insecurity that cannot be rehabilitated, as they are mostly children, orphans, elderlies, incapacitated or people with disabilities or chronic illnesses.





Wayfarer Programme (Daily Hot Meals)

Tkiyet Um Ali's doors were open to children, women and elderlies every day in 2019, serving 85,215 beneficiaries in total.

Noteworthy is that Tkiyet Um Ali opens its doors around noon, all year long, to 400 individuals a day, at its main headquarters near Al-Mahatta station, under the daily meal wayfarer programme. TUA provides hot lunch meals to passers-by that contain proteins, carbohydrates and vitamins, making for 60% of the calories an adult individual needs per day.



Mawa'ed Al Rahman Programme

Tkiyet Um Ali received 89,531 fasting people for Iftar during the Holy Month of Ramadan in 2019. TUA received more than 2,000 women, children, men and elderlies on a daily basis at its main headquarters for a hot Ramadan Iftar meals, throughout the entire month.

Moreover, Tkiyet Um Ali organised Mawa'ed Al Rahman in Ramadan across the various governorates of the Kingdom in cooperation with partner organisations, and provided 26,093 Ramadan Iftar meals to drivers on the highways in cooperation with the Public Security Department - Highway Patrol Department, Traffic Department, Partner CBOs, Zaha Cultural Center, and Haya Cultural Center throughout the holy month.



Adahi Programme

Tkiyet Um Ali performed 21,230 Adahi in 2019 and distributed the Adahi meat shares to 30,000 beneficiary families during the year.

Tkiyet Um Ali performs Adahi during the days of Eid Al Adha in Australia on behalf of donors, under the supervision of an authorised Mufti from the Jordanian General Iftaa Department, whose task is to ensure the Adahi's compliance with Islamic Sharia provisions and that the Adahi are performed on time, during the Tashriq Days. The Adahi meat is then chopped, frozen and shipped to Jordan for storage at TUA's refrigerated warehouses for later distribution to TUA-endorsed families throughout the year. Local Adahi, however, are performed at the slaughterhouses stationed in Amman, for distribution among endorsed families across the Kingdom's governorates during the days of Eid Al Adha.

All throughout 2019, Tkiyet Um Ali received authorisations to perform dhabihah on behalf of donors, to be distributed as fresh meat among endorsed families with the beginning of each month.



The Distribution of Adahi meat in Palestine

Tkiyet Um Ali distributed a portion of the Adahi meat shares from 2018 to nearly 10,000 families in need in Palestine's West Bank and Gaza Strip in 2019, in coordination with the Hashemite Charity Organisation, whose efforts were consolidated with a number of charities and organisations in Palestine for the 9th year in a row, under the joint Solidarity programme "Takatof".



Mawa'ed Al Rahman Programme in Palestine

Tkiyet Um Ali organised 5 Mawa'ed Al Rahman Iftars at Al Haram Al Ibrahimy in Palestine, providing 1,800 Ramadan Iftar meals during the holy month.

Donation Tools

The number of individual donors in 2019 increased to 68,538, due to procedures that were the primary focus of Tkiyet Um Ali in Jordan and abroad; as Jordanian expats from various parts of the world make generous contributions to TUA's efforts, not to mention donors from various other Arab nationalities.


Since establishment to this day, Tkiyet Um Ali has been seeking ways to facilitate the donation process for donors all around the world, by enabling donation tools through multiple portals, so that donors can make their contributions anywhere, any time and in the most convenient manner. These portals are as follows:

1- The Website:

Tkiyet Um Ali revamped its website in 2019, www.tua.jo, to make the donation process easier, by launching a number of new features and updates that facilitate donation online.

2- Smartphone Application:

Tkiyet Um Ali relaunched its smartphone application on both "Android" and "IOS" platforms to facilitate the process of donation from anywhere around the world, with a new design and a number of new features and updates, so that the app is more secure and easier to use.



3- Bank Transfers and Deductions:

Donors can make their donations to Tkiyet Um Ali through bank transfers by transferring the financial sums they want to donate to TUA's accredited bank accounts, or through the monthly recurring system.

4- eFAWATEERcom Service:

TUA made available a variety of channels and portals for donors to contribute through, whether electronic or through ATMs, via the partnership Tkiyet Um Ali established with eFAWATEERcom Service, an online electronic payment service connected with 23 of the banks operating in Jordan.



5- Smartlink Service:

TUA is keen on making it easy for donors to contribute. By clicking on a link sent directly to their e-mail addresses or phones via SMS, the donor is rerouted to a secure web-portal with all the required billing details, allowing donors to simply enter their credit card numbers to make easy, secure and fast donations on the spot.



6- Call Centre:

Tkiyet Um Ali takes all incoming calls on the number (064900900) to answer any inquiries that may come across donors' minds. The call centre also coordinates appointments for collecting contributions from donors through TUA's collection agents.



7- Tkiyet Um Ali's Booths at Commercial Centres:

TUA's booths are spread across 14 locations in the Capital's largest commercial centres, dedicated to serving donors through providing them with all the information they may require on TUA's programmes and answering any questions they might have, in addition to receiving all kinds of donations.



8- Donation Boxes:

Tkiyet Um Ali's Donation Boxes are spread across the Kingdom's governorates, in small and large shops alike, as well as pharmacies, hospitals and other locations, to facilitate donation and allow even the smallest donations, which can have the greatest impact on providing food for families living in extreme food poverty.

9- Tkiyet Um Ali's Headquarters:

Tkiyet Um Ali receives donors at its headquarters in Al-Jaish Street, Al-Mahatta, Amman, during working hours, where TUA staff can answer donors' questions and inquiries and receive their donations.

Donation Schemes

Tkiyet Um Ali allocates all 100% of the donations received from individual and corporate donors to the Sustainable Food Aid Programme, which provides monthly food parcels for 30,000 families, all living in extreme poverty.



Family Sponsorships Programme

TUA allows donors to sponsor families in need to receive monthly food parcels all year long. Each parcel includes 24 commodities, enough to prepare three meals a day for a whole month. The Family Sponsorship Programme offers a range of monthly sponsorship schemes, ranging from (15 - 30 - 50 to 70) Jordanian Dinars per month, depending on the number of members in the family.

Additionally, Tkiyet Um Ali is also open to receiving small monthly donations, to encourage donors to contribute to the provision of food for families in need, with values of 3 or 10 Jordanian Dinars a month.



Monthly Food Parcels Programme

TUA allows donors to donate with the amount equivalent to the value of a single food parcel, containing 24 commodities, delivered at a later stage to TUA beneficiary families. The value of these packages ranges from (15 - 30 - 50 to 70) Jordanian Dinars per package.



Zakat Programme

Monetary Zakat donations to Tkiyet Um Ali are disbursed to the foremost essential recipients of Zakat, which are the impoverished, orphaned and those in need, under an Islamic Fatwa issued by the General Iftaa' Department in Jordan.



Wayfarer Programme (Daily Hot Meals)

This programme allows donors to donate the value of a single lunch meal (JOD 3.00), to be allocated to the Wayfarer Programme, which provides 400 hot lunch meals a day to passers-by and people in need at Tkiyet Um Ali's headquarters.

General Charity Programme (Sadaqa)

Tkiyet Um Ali also receives general Sadaqa from donors, allocated to the support of beneficiary families of the Sustainable Food Aid Programme.

Perpetual Charity Programme (Sadaqa Jariyah)

Tkiyet Um Ali receives Perpetual Sadaqa to provide equipment for beneficiaries of TUA's various programmes.



Adahi Programme

Donors can authorise Tkiyet Um Ali to perform the Udhiyah on their behalf during the days of Eid Al Adha, under the supervision of a Mufti from the Jordanian General Iftaa' Department. The Adahi meat collected from the Adahi Programme is frozen and distributed with the Monthly Food Parcels to TUA beneficiary families all year long.



Sacrifices Programme (Dhabihah)

Tkiyet Um Ali receives all forms of Dhabihah donations all year round, whether Fadu, Nither, Dhabihah or Aqiqah, as Tkiyet Um Ali performs monthly Dhabihah and distributes the meat among beneficiary families in TUA programmes across the Kingdom's governorates.

Volunteering Programmes

Tkiyet Um Ali believes in the importance of raising awareness among members of the society, especially youths, on the issue of hunger and the importance of their role in eradicating food poverty. Being one of the strategic goals of Tkiyet Um Ali, TUA never hesitates to invite and accept volunteers, who are now indispensable to Tkiyet Um Ali's work, contributing directly and effectively in the realisation of TUA's vision, towards a hunger-free Jordan.

TUA received **7,997** volunteers in 2019, eager to lend a hand to Tkiyet Um Ali's various programmes, across its different sectors and age groups and throughout all the Kingdom's governorates. TUA's volunteers spared no effort in the endeavour to help TUA families, projecting the brightest image and donating their time and effort to elevate the living and mental conditions of these families, each to the best of their abilities.



Shouf Bi Ainak Programme:

This programme was designed to introduce volunteers to TUA's operations, starting with visits to its warehouse in Qastal, participating in the packaging of monthly food parcels there, all the way to delivering these parcels to beneficiary families in underdeveloped areas around the Kingdom. Accordingly, this programme is implemented on the third Saturday of every month, over the duration of nine months every year, noting that Saturdays were chosen as it best fits employees who want to volunteer on their days off.



The Food Parcel Packaging Programme:

Volunteers in this programme visit Tkiyet Um Ali's warehouses in Qastal to get acquainted with and partake in the monthly food parcel packaging process, so that these parcels are distributed later on to beneficiary families of the Monthly Food Parcels Programme across the Kingdom.



The Food Parcel Distribution Programme:

Volunteers in this programme participate in the distribution of monthly food parcels to beneficiary families of the Sustainable Food Aid Programme in various governorates of the Kingdom all year long.



Wayfarer Programme:

Tkiyet Um Ali receives 400 people a day at its headquarters in Al-Mahatta, where volunteers may participate in serving hot lunch meals to people in need, every day, Sunday through Thursday of every week, from 12:30 PM through 2:30 PM.



Mawa'ed Al Rahman Programme:

Tkiyet Um Ali's doors are open throughout the Holy Month of Ramadan to receive fasting people for Iftar around the call to Maghrib Prayer every day, where 100 volunteers participate in serving Iftar to fasting men, women and children throughout the month.



The Office Work Programme:

Tkiyet Um Ali receives volunteers under this programme to partake in the daily operations implemented by TUA and get acquainted with the organisation's various operations, mechanisms and procedures throughout different directorates and departments.



The Field Studies Programme:

Volunteers in this programme participate in the Family Endorsement and Operations Department's family endorsement process, joining in fieldwork and visits to explore the basis of assessing the reality of families who apply for endorsement in the Sustainable Food Aid Programme and the conformity of their actual living conditions to the results of the desk study. The programme also familiarises volunteers with TUA's decision-making mechanisms for endorsing families based on the adopted eligibility criteria.



The Home Renovation Programme:

Volunteering programmes in Tkiyet Um Ali are not exclusive to the provision of food aid to beneficiary families. TUA's efforts go beyond that to renovating these families' places of residence, from entrances all the way to the rooms and quarters, in order to elevate their living conditions.



The Garden Planting Programme:

Volunteers in this programme contribute to planting school gardens in remote and underprivileged areas close to the residences of TUA's beneficiary families. This programme helps beautify these areas and develop their environment.



The Storytelling Programme:

Volunteers in this programme read stories to the children of TUA's beneficiary families.



Teaching Children to Draw Programme:

This programme is focused on unleashing the imagination of TUA-beneficiary families' children, where volunteers spare no effort to develop the children's drawing skills, which contributes to developing their self expression capabilities and unleashing their creativity.



The Seniors' Companion Programme:

This programme paves the passage for volunteers into the homes of elderly beneficiaries to visit them and alleviate the burden of their loneliness through spending quality time with them and bringing joy into their lives, one way or another.



The Handicraft Programme:

This programme is based on the volunteers' participation with the children of TUA's endorsed families in the making of small handicrafts in such a way that would encourage them to unleash the children's creative and innovative energies and incentivise them to come up with new ideas in the design of unique creative products. Accordingly, volunteers provide the requirements for the volunteering programme in coordination with TUA staff.



Article by Dr Hassan Abu Arqoub, published in Al Dustour on 2 July 2019, entitled "A different form of worship with Tkiyet Um Ali"



Her Royal Highness Princess Haya Bint Al Hussein founded Tkiyet Um Ali in 2003, for the purpose of eradicating hunger and feeding those in need, like all other Takaya throughout history. Some three years ago, I was familiarised with Tkiyet Um Ali's approach through its Director General, Mr. Samer Balkar; a very kind, polite and respectful human being. What I liked about Tkiyet Um Ali was the fact that it operated on humane, scientific basis, which is the cornerstone of its success.

Tkiyet Um Ali divides donations into categories, such as: penances for not fasting the Holy Month of Ramadan, the Zakat, the Monthly Food Parcels Programme, Mawaed Al Rahman Programme, Family Sponsorships Programme, the Adahi Programme, Zakat and general donations.

Its growth has been continuous over the years, as the number of those the organisation feeds and sponsors grows with each year. This year, their mission is to feed 40,000 families in Ramadan.

If anything, this indicates a number of things, chief among them are that Tkiyet Um Ali's work is developing, the number of people in need is not small and the generous people in our country are worthy of gratitude and respect.

Two days ago, I participated in the food serving process at the Tkiyet Um Ali Ramadan tent, where the organisation hosts its regular Mawaed Al Rahman, opening its gates to all who seek to have Iftar meals. I will never forget the feelings that overwhelmed me as I poured rice for the visitors between 7:15 and 7:50. My colleagues would serve them the rest of their meals, be it meat, stew, fruits or juice.

Dignities unscathed, people in need flow into the tent and you can see the joy on their faces with the first scoop of food in their plates; clean food that smells good, and special services for the elderly, as they enter through a separate gate and their food comes to them, without requiring to stand in line to get it.

Health and cleanliness is paramount to Tkiyet Um Ali.

Observing the organisation at work, one would think the workers are about to perform surgery, covering their hands and heads and putting on face masks, as you rarely see such attention to health and cleanliness in even the fanciest culinary and food outlets.

My fingers swelled up as I served the food and my back was pained by the level of activity that I wasn't used to. Yet, the sense of joy and humanity that took over me that day puts all of these measly pains away; gone, erased by the overwhelming joy on the visitors faces and the glimmer of happiness in their eyes, happy that they are about to eat clean and healthy food, with their dignities whole and guarded.


It was a form of worship that was entirely new to me.

Worship is not only to stand in line behind the Imam for prayer. Worship is standing up to feed those in need and those breaking their fast. Worship is not only spending your money on building mosques, but eradicating the hunger of those impoverished, which is one of the greatest forms of worship there is, ever.

Here is where Tkiyet Um Ali (TUA) provides an exemplary, unique model in safeguarding the dignity of their beneficiaries.

Foremost in Tkiyet Um Ali's efforts to preserve the dignity of its beneficiaries is that it receives assistance requests from people in need through the organisation's call centre, which employs (12) people whose task is to receive assistance requests and refer them to the specialised departments within Tkiyet Um Ali. Those departments then follow up and carry out the necessary procedures. The organisation also accepts assistance requests through partner charities spread across the country, numbering some (280) charity organisations.

Therefore it is worth mentioning that Tkiyet Um Ali preserves the dignity of those in need at first instance, sparing them the embarrassment of first interviews and personally coming down to its headquarters.

The second measure by TUA to safeguard the dignity of those in need, is ensuring that distribution centres are no more than (5) kilometres away from the beneficiaries' residences, to avoid them efforts and costs of travelling long distances.


Another aspect of this great virtuous effort is that Tkiyet Um Ali feeds its beneficiaries from the same food that middle-class Jordanian families eat. It provides monthly food packages to beneficiary families containing a variation of (22) foodstuff products of the average Jordanian family consumption.

Also in an attempt to preserve these families' feelings, and to ensure that these products are not imposed on them, TUA conducts a survey every three months to ensure beneficiaries' satisfaction over the services they receive. The satisfaction rate touches at (93%), meaning that nothing is imposed or forced onto beneficiaries, rather their opinions are heard in regard to what is provided for them.

Noteworthy too is the fact that Tkiyet Um Ali provides the best food quality out there, supplied through an outsourced supplier of these products, which are selected and stored in optimal storage conditions in conformity with ISO 22000 Standards, under the daily supervision of TUA teams, who run sustainable monitoring operations across all of Tkiyet Um Ali's warehouses.

All of this is to preserve the safety of the food provided to the beneficiaries of TUA, who are in need of its services, while safeguarding, above all, their dignity.





A story of one of Tkiyet Um Ali's

“ It is six in the morning, in the South Jordanian city of Ma’an, where this young girl called Tamam prepares for her daily journey from the rosy mountains where she lives, to her first grade classroom, some twenty minutes away.

Tamam’s family lives in a cave in the mountains, and every morning, with an empty stomach, she and her four siblings take the long unpaved road to school on foot.

Without water or electricity, unsheltered from the wind and the cold, the family’s only source of income is their national welfare stipend, which does not exceed in net, per each member of the family, the total sum of four Jordanian Dinars a month.

For years, Tamam’s mother was used to fetching water from the spring down at the base of the mountain, and handwashing their clothes. Every morning, she would put whatever food she can muster on the fire until her four kids go to school, on empty stomach, as she has become used to sending them off without any breakfast.

Neither Tamam nor her family ever knew what it meant to sleep on a full stomach every night, until Tkiyet Um Ali walked into their lives, through the rocky gates of the mountain cave they call home.

Since then, Tamam and her siblings have been going to school every day with their pockets full of food and nothing less than the prospect of a full meal waiting for them to return home.

Every day, Tamam takes a jam sandwich with her to school after having breakfast with her siblings, whose favourite daily starter is milk and cookies.

“Had it not been for Tkiyet Um Ali, prayer would have been our only sustenance, and my kids would have all left school to find something to eat,” says the mother.”



Events

In the year 2019, Tkiyet Um Ali organised a variety of activities aimed at raising awareness among individuals of society on the issue of food poverty, which is the cause TUA is dedicated to combating and eradicating, as well as introducing people to its food aid programmes.



Summer Training Programme “Awal Khebra”

Tkiyet Um Ali received 47 students from 22 schools, from outside and inside Jordan, in the second Summer Training Programme “Awal Khebra”, summer of 2019, which allowed students to get acquainted with Tkiyet Um Ali’s operations and participate with TUA employees in the implementation of daily tasks. The students’ partaking in the programme helped polish their skills and grow capabilities in alignment with the requirements of the labour market, as they concluded more than 60 hours of training each, completing 2,301 training hours collectively.



Sesame Street

Tkiyet Um Ali organised Sesame Street activities in cooperation with six schools and kindergartens, targeting 988 students from various schools, aimed at investing the children's energies and raising their awareness on the issue of food poverty in Jordan.



The Food Parcels' Packaging Competition

Tkiyet Um Ali organised two Food Parcels' Packaging Competitions, aimed at boosting societal awareness of the value of the parcels TUA distributes to beneficiary families. Sixty-five volunteers from four different organisations participated in packaging 600 parcels. Among institutions that took part were Al Nisr Al Arabi Insurance Company, who landed in the first place; MS Pharma, who came in second; Careem, third; and Al Ahli Bank, which came in fourth. In the second competition, 63 volunteers participated from four other organisations, namely Arab Bank, which came in first; Umniah, which came in second; Estarta Solutions, third; and Zain, at fourth place.



Eid Al Adha Event

Tkiyet Um Ali organised a festive activity on the first day of Eid Al Adha at its headquarters in Amman, celebrating one hundred children of beneficiary families of TUA's Sustainable Food Aid Programme. The event brought joy and happiness to the hearts of the children on the occasion of Eid Al Adha, through various entertainment activities, including competitions, games and face painting, with the participation of a magician and several popular children cartoon characters, in addition to the distribution of gifts for participating children.



International Volunteer Day

Tkiyet Um Ali celebrated International Volunteer Day, which falls on December 5th of each year, to underscore the importance of volunteerism as a noble humanitarian value, and in an effort to celebrate volunteer work and volunteers and reinforce their role in the attainment of inclusive development in their societies.

To that end, 100 TUA employees volunteered to sort clothes at the Clothing Bank’s storage facilities as part of the World Volunteer Day activities, which is celebrated worldwide on the same date every year.



Al Musahharati Event

Tkiyet Um Ali’s Ladies Committee, in 2019, organised the Musahharati Event for children at Haya Cultural Center, celebrating children with the attendance of the Musahharati character. The revenues from tickets sold went to supporting beneficiary families of TUA’s programmes.

In a first-of-its-kind initiative in the field of social responsibility, the President of the University of Jordan, Dr. Abdul Karim Al-Qudah, inaugurated the representative office of Tkiyet Um Ali and Dar Abu Abdullah in the presence of the First Vice President of the Board of Directors of the two organisations, H.E. Taher Masri, their Director General Samer Balkar and a number of board members and a group of senior officials and academics at the university.

Tkiyet Um Ali also organised the launching ceremony of the University of Jordan and the two organisations first strategic partnership initiative, as part of its efforts to increase awareness among the University of Jordan's community of the goals of Tkiyet Um Ali and introducing them to its programmes, in addition to encouraging faculty members and students to participate and volunteer with the programmes of both organisations.

The ceremony was concluded with the implementation of one of the initiatives, in the form of a march, led by the Jordan Armed Forces band, in which students of the university participated also, from the Faculty of Business to the Tkiyet Um Ali and Dar Abu Abdullah liaison office at the Student Affairs Deanship building. The aim of the march was to raise UJ community's awareness on the works implemented by the liaison office, introduce them to their volunteering programmes and encourage them to participate or donate. Flyers were also distributed among the students to enrich their knowledge on the achievements of those two organisations and encourage them to partake in their programmes.



Dubai International Humanitarian Aid & Development Conference & Exhibition (DIHAD)

Tkiyet Um Ali participated in the 16th edition of the Dubai International Humanitarian Aid & Development Conference & Exhibition (DIHAD) in Dubai, UAE, under the patronage of His Highness Sheikh Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum, UAE Vice President and Prime Minister and Ruler of Dubai. Through its participation in DIHAD, Tkiyet Um Ali sought to unlock doorways of communication with international and non-profit organisations, as well as humanitarian aid entities.

TUA also sought, through participation at DIHAD, to introduce the region to its various programmes, which are focused on eradicating hunger in Jordan through the provision of Sustainable Food Aid for the families living in extreme food poverty.

The DIHAD conference and exhibition is a prominent humanitarian event aimed at furthering cooperation in humanitarian aid regionally and internationally, towards making a qualitative leap in the level of joint efforts exerted to develop humanitarian frameworks and the coordination of programmes and humanitarian stances on issues that undermine societies and their capabilities to meet their basic human needs.



Think Inside the Box Campagin

Coinciding with the Holy Month of Ramadan, Tkiyet Um Ali launched "Think inside the Box" campaign to highlight the impact of the monthly food parcels on the TUA's beneficiary families. 


Growth Ratios and Figures of Tkiyet Um Ali's Programmes



Food Parcels Distributed by Tkiyet Um Ali (2017-2019)




Tkiyet Um Ali's Endorsed Families (2017-2019)







Number of Daily Hot Meals Served (2017 - 2019)








Number of Sacrifices (Adahi) Performed (2017-2019)





Number of Families Sponsored by Donors (2017-2019)







Number of Annual Donors (2017-2019)

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Tkiyet Um Ali - (Non for Profit Organization) (the "Tkiye"), which comprise the statement of assets and liabilities as of 31 December 2019 and the statement of revenues and expenses, statement of accumulated surplus and the statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, assets and liabilities of the Tkiye as of 31 December 2019, and its revenues and expenses and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with the Tkiye procedures and the adopted accounting policies as in Note (3).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs). Our responsibilities under those standards, are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Tkiye in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' *Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants* (including International Independence Standards) (IESBA Code) together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in Jordan, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the IESBA Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Emphasis of Matter

Without qualifying our opinion, and as disclosed in note (2) to the financial statements, the financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies adopted by the Tkiye. As a result, our report is intended solely for Tkiye management purposes and should not be used for other purposes or parties.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the Tkiye's procedures and the adopted accounting policies as in Note (3), and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Tkiye's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Tkiye's or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Tkiye's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion.

Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with ISAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with ISAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However future events or conditions may cause the Tkiye to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

The Tkiye maintains proper books of accounts, which are in agreement with the financial statements.




